



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR CAST, PARENTS AND CARE GIVERS

From the Makeup Team

You will need to provide either 3 packets of face wipes (not baby wipes) or makeup remover and cotton swabs, they will be yours and will stay in your container at your makeup station. You will need them from the start of Dress Rehearsals.

We make every effort to ensure the Makeup Department works as hygienically as possible. Each cast member has their own set of makeup, head gear, wigs and hats and these are named and used only by the person they have been allocated to.

In order to help us maintain this standard of hygiene we are asking you to provide the following for the duration of the show.

Guys

1. For those of you who shave please do so prior to coming to the theatre each day.
2. Please bring a **NAMED** comb which you will leave at the Theatre for the duration of the Show.

Girls

1. Please come to the Theatre without any makeup of any description on and please do not wash your hair in the afternoon before you come, please wash it either after the show or in the morning, it is easier for us to work with if it is not wet or freshly washed.
2. You are asked to provide a **NAMED** brush, **NAMED** comb, hair ties **no metal jointers**, hair pins **some small and large** - either black, brown or blonde depending on your hair colour. These will need to be left at your makeup station for the duration of the show.
3. All earrings are to be removed and replaced with small studs. (These may have to be covered with flesh coloured sticking plaster if they catch the light on stage)

COMBS AND BRUSHES WILL NEED TO FIT INTO AN ICE CREAM CONTAINER (WHICH WE SUPPLY)

As most of you would not be used to wearing makeup daily we suggest that it could be beneficial to start using a moisturiser twice daily from now and continue to do so during the show so as to help your skin to not dry out.

All makeup must be removed prior to leaving the theatre. This will be done with the wipes or remover. We suggest it is good practice that you give your faces a thorough wash with a flannel and soapy water when you get home.

Stage makeup is a much heavier than street makeup and in order to look after your skin it is wise to ensure it is cleaned thoroughly after each performance. Another helpful hint is to do a steam bath for your face every three or so days this will also help remove any excess makeup.
